Usage in a radiogram:

1. Add "ARL" to check, e.g. if the check numbers are 8/6, send as "ARL 8/6"
2. In message, precede each ARL message with "ARL", e.g. "ARL SIXTY NINE NZ NET"
3. Always spell the ARL number in full but do not use hyphens, e.g. ARL SIXTY EIGHT
